



Nainuwa™ - open your mind

Nainuwa is the Latin notation of the Arabic articulation of Nineveh (Arabic: نينــــوى, Naīnuwa)

Nineveh was a Mesopotamian city that was founded in 1800 AD and destroyed in 700 AD. Hence Nineveh was far older than the city Alexandria (which was founded 331 AD). Like Alexandria also Nineveh had a library, the "Royal Library of Ashurbanipal". This library had -in about 25,000 demonstratively cuneiform clay tablets- the whole knowledge of that time collected.
